SCE&G this morning will reduce the amount of water it is releasing into the lower Saluda River by about 25 percent; that's in addition to a reduction of about 20 percent from last night. "We've seen a slowdown in the amount of water flowing into Lake Murray from upstream, so we are further decreasing the amount of water we are releasing as we continue to safely and effectively manage lake levels," said spokesman Jim Landreth, Vice President of Fossil Hydro Operations for SCE&G. "We will continue to monitor inflows, and adjust outflows accordingly."
