## **Please Note:**

- Lexington County residents may bring up to five electronics to the Edmund Landfill year-round at no charge.
- Events are held rain or shine but times and materials collected are subject to change. To be notified by email of event details prior to each event, contact Traude Sander, Lexington County Recycling Coordinator at tsander@lex-co.com or (803) 785-3340.

- Events are for Lexington County residents only unless stated otherwise. Be prepared to show a driver's license or other proof of county residence.
- Material generated by businesses will **not** be accepted. Businesses may bring small amounts of recyclables to the Edmund Landfill.
- Residents are asked to stay in their vehicles at events to keep traffic moving. Volunteers are on site to help unload recyclables from vehicles as residents drive through the parking lot and stop at drop-off stations.
- Limits are as follows: Up to 5 boxes/bags of paper, up to 8 electronics (small items and computer components are bundled to count as "one"), up to 8 gallons of liquid paint at Household Hazardous Waste collections, up to 8 tires at tire collections and up to 2500 pounds solid and 300 gallons of liquids at pesticide collections. No limits on other items listed.
- Refrigerators and other appliances with Freon are **not** accepted at drop-off events. These may be brought to the Edmund Landfill by Lexington County residents (for \$15/item).
- Lexington County reserves the right to designate the end of the line using a vehicle and/or signs. In the event of excessive turn out, the end of line may be designated prior to the event end time to allow cars time to get through.
- All events are co-sponsored by the County of Lexington and Keep the Midlands Beautiful. Other organizations assist with one or more events each year including the Lexington County Stormwater Consortium, the SC Department of Agriculture, Richland County, the City of Columbia, the Town of Batesburg-Leesville, the Town of Irmo, the Riverbanks Zoo and Garden, and High School students from Batesburg-Leesville, Irmo, and White Knoll.

## Please Note:

Up to 5 electronics are accepted per day for free from Lexington County residents at the Edmund Landfill, Mon-Sat 7 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Paint, when <u>completely dried</u> with sand or kitty litter may be placed in household garbage.
